



## Indian Peaks Men's League 2-Man Best Ball Sunday, May 17th 2020

TIME: Tee-times 8:00am

FORMAT: 2-Man Best Ball

Please keep score on the Indian Peaks App or keep your own scorecard. Do not trade cards! Be sure to keep your playing competitors scores to compare following the round.

Player tees based on H.I., teams are flighted by handicap. Handicaps adjusted to tees played, Rule 3-5. Players receive 90% handicap per USGA recommendation.

- 1.) USGA rules shall govern all play.
- 2.) In bunkers you may lift and place the ball within one club length remaining in the bunker no closer to the hole.
- 3.) On hole #1, out-of-bounds on the left of lake is indicated by red stakes with white tops, and extends beyond the lake between holes #1 and #9 as indicated with white stakes.
- 4.) Players are reminded to always be aware of their speed of play and their position on the course in relation to the group ahead. Penalties may be assessed for violation of the Pace of Play Policy in the Men's League packet. In the interest of speed of play, players have the option to play a provisional ball for any ball that may be out-of-bounds or lost outside of a water hazard. The player must indicate to his scorer his intention to hit a provisional ball, and he must play it before he goes forward to search for the original ball

**DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE:** In stroke play, if a competitor is doubtful of his rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole, he may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to his marker or a fellow competitor that he intends to play two balls and which ball he wished to count if the Rules permit. The competitor must report the facts of the situation to the Committee before returning his scorecard.

**IPML Decision:** Indian Peaks Men's League will allow distance measuring devices in tournaments in 2020. Devices that only measure distance will be allowed. This includes GPS systems, visual range finders, and the like. Devices that measure other conditions (wind speed, elevation changes, etc.) are prohibited. Also prohibited are devices that help find lost balls (i.e. RadarGolf).
