TIME: Shotgun Start at 8:30am

TEES: BLUE TEES

FORMAT: Individual Stroke Play, full handicap

We will pay one place Gross, and four places Net.

POINTS STANDINGS: This is the last event in determining Player of the Year honors. 3X Player Points for this event. Player with the highest point total is crowned Player of the Year. In the event of a tie for Player of the Year, we will have a sudden-death playoff beginning on hole #1, strokes where they fall on the scorecard.

Players Championship Points: 1<sup>st</sup> Gross-210 pts., 1<sup>st</sup> Net-210 pts., 2<sup>nd</sup> Net-180 pts., 3<sup>rd</sup> Net-150 pts., 4<sup>th</sup> Net-120 pts., 5<sup>th</sup> Net-90 pts. *NO PARTICIPATION POINTS AWARDED FOR PLAYERS CHAMPIONSHIP.*

#### SPECIAL EVENTS:

Hole #5-Closest to Pin

Hole #8-Closest to Pin

- 1.) USGA rules shall govern all play.
- 2.) On hole #1, out-of-bounds on the left of lake is indicated by red stakes with white tops, and extends beyond the lake between holes #1 and #9 as indicated with white stakes.
- 3.) Players are reminded to always be aware of their speed of play and their position on the course in relation to the group ahead. Penalties may be assessed for violation of the Pace of Play Policy in the Men's League packet. In the interest of speed of play, players have the option to play a provisional ball for any ball that may be out-of-bounds or lost outside of a water hazard. The player must indicate to his scorer his intention to hit a provisional ball, and he must play it before he goes forward to search for the original ball

Scores from IP Men's League events will be posted for you as Tournament Scores. Please **DO NOT** post these scores as double-posting could result

**DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE:** In stroke play, if a competitor is doubtful of his rights or the correct procedure during the play of a hole, he may, without penalty, complete the hole with two balls. After the doubtful situation has arisen and before taking further action, the competitor must announce to his marker or a fellow competitor that he intends to play two balls and which ball he wished to count if the Rules permit. The competitor must report the facts of the situation to the Committee before returning his scorecard.

**IPML Decision:** Indian Peaks Men's League will allow distance measuring devices in tournaments in 2014. Devices that only measure distance will be allowed. This includes GPS systems, visual range finders, and the like. Devices that measure other conditions (wind speed, elevation changes, etc.) are prohibited. Also prohibited are devices that help find lost balls (i.e. RadarGolf).
